#### 1 Chair

Councillor Macrae, being Chair of the Moray Local Review Body, chaired the meeting.

#### 2 Declaration of Group Decisions and Members Interests

In terms of Standing Order 20 and the Councillor's Code of Conduct, there were no declarations from Group Leaders or Spokespersons in regard to any prior decision taken on how Members will vote on any item on the agenda.

Councillor Dunbar declared an interest in Item 6 - Case LR273 and stated that she would leave the meeting and not take any part in the consideration of this item. There were no other declarations of Members interests in respect of the items on the agenda.

#### 3 Minute of meeting dated 16 June 2022

The Minute of the meeting dated 16 June 2022 was submitted and approved.

#### 4 LR274 - Ward 5 - Heldon and Laich

Planning Application 21/01277/APP – Demolish existing house and erect new dwellinghouse at 3 Town Hall Lane, Lossiemouth, Moray, IV31 6DF

A request was submitted by the Applicant seeking a review of the decision of the Appointed Officer, in terms of the Scheme of Delegation, to refuse planning permission on the grounds that:

The proposal is contrary to the provisions of the Moray Local Development Plan 2020 because:

- 1. The large split level contemporary design proposed on this elevated prominent cliff top location would have an excessive over dominant impact on the site and its surrounds. The overall design, form, appearance and finish of the dwelling would be at odds with the more traditional existing established character at this locality resulting in a design which is out of character and incongruous to the site and its surrounds. The proposal therefore fails to reflect the traditional settlement character as required by Policy EP3 (i) b) and DP1 (i).
- 2. The design moves the footprint of the dwelling closer to the existing houses to the north therefore taking account of the extensive glazing and large outdoor terrace/balcony areas the design is also considered to result in unacceptable overlooking and privacy impacts for these existing neighbouring residential properties to the north of the site. The proposal therefore also fails to comply with the amenity considerations set out in policy DP1 (i) part (e).

A Summary of Information Report set out the reasons for refusal, together with the documents considered or prepared by the Appointed Officer in respect of the planning application, in addition to the Notice of Review, Grounds for Review and supporting documents submitted by the Applicant.

In response to a question from the Chair as to whether the Legal or Planning Advisers had any preliminary matters to raise, the Legal Adviser advised that he had nothing to raise at this time.

The Planning Adviser highlighted an inaccuracy in the Applicant's Statement of Case where reference was made to planning policy DP1 being introduced in June 2021 when all policies within the Moray Local Development Plan 2020 were adopted in May 2020. This was noted.

The Chair then asked the Moray Local Review Body (MLRB) if it had sufficient information to determine the request for review. In response, the MLRB unanimously agreed that it had sufficient information to determine the case.

During discussion surrounding the reasons why the planning application had been refused, Councillor McBain noted that one of the reasons was due to the contemporary design of the proposal which was not considered to be in keeping with the other traditional buildings in the area. Councillor McBain noted that a contemporary dwelling had already been build next to the proposed development and was of the view that the proposal would have no impact or disadvantage on surrounding properties and moved that the appeal be upheld and planning permission granted in respect of Planning Application 21/01277/APP as the proposal is an acceptable departure from policies EP3 (Special Landscape Areas and Landscape Character) (i) b) and DP1 (Development Principles) (i). This was seconded by Councillor Dunbar.

Councillor Cameron acknowledged that the planning application was for a stunning development however agreed with the Appointed Officer in that it did not fit with the surrounding area and moved that the MLRB refuse the appeal and uphold the original decision of the Appointed Officer to refuse planning permission in respect of Planning Application 21/01277/APP as it is contrary to policies EP3 (Special

Landscape Areas and Landscape Character) (i) b) and DP1 (Development Principles) (i). This was seconded by Councillor Keith.

Accordingly, the Amendment became the finding of the MLRB and it was agreed to refuse the appeal and uphold the original decision of the Appointed Officer to refuse planning application 21/01277/APP as it is contrary to policies EP3 (Special Landscape Areas and Landscape Character) (i) b) and DP1 (Development Principles) (i).

#### 5 **LR275 - Ward 3 - Buckie**

# Planning Application 22/00140/APP – Replace modern windows that have failed for other modern windows at 6 Burnside Street, Findochty

A request was submitted by the Applicant seeking a review of the decision of the Appointed Officer, in terms of the Scheme of Delegation, to refuse planning permission on the grounds that:

The proposed development is contrary to Policy DP1: Development Principles, Policy EP10: Listed Buildings and Policy EP9: Conservation Areas of the adopted Moray Local Development Plan 2020 and, as a material consideration, associated Replacement Windows and Doors Guidance for the following reasons:

- The use of non-traditional materials such as UPVC is not acceptable for use on listed buildings and the proposed UPVC windows do not preserve the character and special historic interest of the listed building.
- 2. The use of UPVC windows would not be in compliance with Historic Environment Scotland advice on alterations to listed buildings (Managing Change in the Historic Environment Windows) nor with the Moray Council's Replacement Windows and Doors Guidance which is clear that the use of non-traditional materials such as UPVC will not be acceptable in listed buildings.
- 3. The proposed development would not preserve and enhance the character and appearance of Findochty Outstanding Conservation Area.

A Summary of Information Report set out the reasons for refusal, together with the documents considered or prepared by the Appointed Officer in respect of the planning application, in addition to the Notice of Review, Grounds for Review and supporting documents submitted by the Applicant.

In response to a question from the Chair as to whether the Legal or Planning Advisers had any preliminary matters to raise, both the Legal and Planning Advisers advised that they had nothing to raise at this time.

The Chair then asked the Moray Local Review Body (MLRB) if it had sufficient information to determine the request for review. In response, the MLRB unanimously agreed that it had sufficient information to determine the case.

During discussion, Councillor Ross stated that it was clear that the windows in the property needed replaced. He noted that there was already a lot of houses in the conservation area that had UPVC windows. He also noted the climate emergency and the cost of living crisis. In all the circumstances he moved that the MLRB uphold the appeal and grant planning permission in respect of Planning Application 22/00140/APP as an acceptable departure to policies DP1 (Development Principles), Policy EP10 (Listed Buildings) and Policy EP9 (Conservation Areas) of the adopted Moray Local Development Plan (MLDP) 2020 and, as a material consideration, associated Replacement Windows and Doors Guidance, stating that, in his view, it was unfair to impose this financial burden on the Applicant. This was seconded by Councillor Warren.

Councillor McBain agreed with Councillor Ross in that it was clear that the windows needed to be replaced and noted that the existing windows were aluminium and not wood and was of the view that UPVC windows would be more in keeping with the character of the area than aluminium.

Councillor Keith stated that the subject of replacing windows in conservation areas and on listed buildings with UPVC is regularly debated however the Council has adopted the policies within the MLDP 2020 therefore should uphold them. He therefore moved, as an amendment, that the MLRB uphold the original decision of the Appointed Officer and refuse planning permission in respect of Planning Application 22/00140/APP as the application is contrary to policies DP1 (Development Principles), Policy EP10 (Listed Buildings) and Policy EP9 (Conservation Areas) of the adopted Moray MLDP 2020 and, as a material consideration, associated Replacement Windows and Doors Guidance. This was seconded by Councillor Cameron.

Accordingly, the Motion became the finding of the MLRB and it was agreed to uphold the appeal and grant planning permission in respect of Planning Application 22/00140/APP as an acceptable departure to policies DP1 (Development Principles), Policy EP10 (Listed Buildings) and Policy EP9 (Conservation Areas) of the adopted Moray Local Development Plan (MLDP) 2020 and, as a material consideration, associated Replacement Windows and Doors Guidance.

#### 6 LR276 - Ward 7 - Elgin City South

Councillor Dunbar, having declared an interest in this item, left the meeting at this juncture.

# Planning Application 22/00130/APP - Erect outbuilding for use as hair salon/beauty parlour at 14 Turnberry Crescent, Elgin

A request was submitted by the Applicant seeking a review of the decision of the Appointed Officer, in terms of the Scheme of Delegation, to refuse planning permission on the grounds that:

The proposal is contrary to policy DP1 - Development Principles of the Moray Local Development Plan (MLDP) 2020 because the introduction of a business use to which there would be visiting members of the public is considered to result in an adverse impact on the amenity of neighbouring properties in the surrounding residential area.

A Summary of Information Report set out the reasons for refusal, together with the documents considered or prepared by the Appointed Officer in respect of the planning application, in addition to the Notice of Review, Grounds for Review and supporting documents submitted by the Applicant.

In response to a question from the Chair as to whether the Legal or Planning Advisers had any preliminary matters to raise, both the Legal and Planning Advisers advised that they had nothing to raise at this time.

The Chair then asked the Moray Local Review Body (MLRB) if it had sufficient information to determine the request for review. In response, the MLRB unanimously agreed that it had sufficient information to determine to case.

Following consideration, the MLRB agreed to uphold the original decision of the Appointed Officer to refuse planning permission in respect of Planning Application 22/00130/APP as the proposal is contrary to policy DP1 (Development Principles) of the MLDP 2020.

#### **SUMMARY OF INFORMATION FOR CASE No LR278**

Planning Application 22/00542/PPP – Proposed dwelling-house and detached garage at site adjacent to 1-5 South Darkland, Lhanbryde, Elgin

#### Ward 4 – Fochabers and Lhanbryde

Planning permission in principle was refused under the Statutory Scheme of Delegation by the Appointed Officer on 27 May 2022 on the grounds that:

The proposal is contrary to policies DP4 Part d) ii), DP1(i) and EP4 for the following reasons:

- (i) The proposal site falls within the Pressurised and Sensitive Area identified by Policy DP4 Part d) ii), in which no new house sites will be permitted due to the detrimental landscape and visual impacts associated with high levels of rural housing build up in these areas. The proposed house in this location is contrary to Policy DP4 and DP1(i). The proposed new dwellinghouse will have an adverse impact on the character and appearance of the surrounding area given that the site lacks the required immediate (on the boundary of the site) backdrop of existing landform, trees and buildings to provide acceptable enclosure.
- (ii) iThe proposed introduction of a further house in this location alongside existing housing is considered to constitute an unacceptable cumulative build-up of housing which will negatively impact the landscape character of this area.
- (iii) The site falls within the Countryside Around Towns Area identified by Policy EP4, in which no new rural housing will be permitted unless the proposal involves the rehabilitation, conversion, limited extension, replacement; or change of use of existing buildings or for the purpose of agriculture, forestry or low intensity recreational or tourism; or is designated as long term housing allocation released for development. The proposals do not fall within any of the above criteria and will result in development sprawl into the countryside affecting the special character of this area.

Documents considered or prepared by the Appointed Officer in respect of the above planning application are attached as **Appendix 1**.

The Notice of the Review, Grounds for Review and any supporting documents submitted by the Applicant are attached as **Appendix 2**.

Further Representations received in response to the Notice of Review are attached as **Appendix 3.** 

No representation was received from the Applicant in response to the Further Representations.







  - i) a detailed drawing (scale 1:500 or 1:1000 which shall also include details to demonstrate control of the land) showing the visibility splay 3.0 metres by 100 metres to the east, and 3.0 metres by 120 metres to the west, and a schedule of maintenance for the splay area has been submitted to and approved by the Council, as Planning Authority in consultation with the Roads Authority; and
  - ii) thereafter the visibility splay shall be provided in accordance with the approved drawing prior to any works commencing (except for those works associated with the provision of the visibility splay); and



Summary and Assessment of main issues raised by representations

Issue: Contrary to the Moray Local Development Plan 2020.

**Comments (PO):** The proposed site sits within both a Pressurised and Sensitive Area and an area of Countryside Around Town where no new housing is permitted within these identified areas.

**Issue:** Giant Hogweed was identified on site and was sprayed with weed killer, however there is no guarantee that it was eradicated.

**Comments (PO):** This is not a material planning consideration and is subject to separate legislative controls.

Issue: Loss of natural light due to trees on front boundary line.

**Comments (PO):** Species of all tree/hedge planting, numbers and spacing will require to be addressed in any forthcoming application for planning permission; any potential light impacts from trees proposed along the site boundary would be assessed at that time.

**Issue:** There is existing drainage issues where Darkland Road floods to a depth of 0.5m near the junction with South Darkland. This is caused by poor drainage from the ditch and a pipe that crosses the road and the field to the north.

**Comments (PO:** The Flood Risk management Team were consulted on this matter and have raised no concerns at this stage, however if an application for full planning was submitted, more details would be required and would be assessed at that time.

Issue: The access to Darklands Road has poor surfacing and poor visibility.

**Comments (PO):** The Transportation Manager has raised no objections to the proposal on road safety grounds, subject to conditions including the provision of visibility splays and the upkeep of the splays, as well as the first 10m of existing track from carriageway upgraded and surfaced with bituminous macadam across its full existing width and that any new boundary walls or fences be set back from the edge of the public road at a minimum distance of 2m behind the required visibility splays.

**Issue:** Other recent applications for planning permission along the Darklands Road have not complied with planning conditions implemented.

**Comments (PO):** This is not a material planning consideration when assessing this application however, these comments have been passed to the Condition Monitoring Officer to investigate.

**Issue:** The access track to South Darklands is the responsibility of the householders and is not a hard surface and therefore would not withstand construction traffic associated with a new build house.

**Comments (PO):** The Transportation Manager has no raised no objections subject to conditions including the first 10m of the access to be surfaced in bituminous macadam across the full existing width. Beyond this point the remainder of the track and its maintenance is a private matter. Therefore any issues in relation to shared access would be dealt with between owners and are not a material planning matter.

#### **OBSERVATIONS - ASSESSMENT OF PROPOSAL**

#### **Policy**

Section 25 of the 1997 Act as amended requires applications to be determined in accordance with the development plan, i.e. the adopted Moray Local Development Plan 2020 (MLDP) unless material considerations indicate otherwise. The main planning issues are considered below:

### The Proposal

An application for planning permission in principle (PPP) for the erection of a dwellinghouse and detached garage on a plot of land adjacent to 1-5 South Darklands, Lhanbryde. This application seeks to determine whether the principle of a dwellinghouse being erected on this site is acceptable. The proposed site plan shows an indicative layout with the dwellinghouse and garage situated at the north end of the site adjacent to number 5. The site plan also shows both a private waste septic tank and a surface water soakaway and a variety of landscaping around the boundaries of the site.

### The Site and Surroundings

The proposed house would sit on an area of land adjacent to the access track for the area known as South Darkland. The site sits within both a Pressurised and Sensitive Area and an area of Countryside Around Towns (Elgin) as identified in the Moray local Development Plan 2020, and is located around 2km to the north west of the centre of the settlement of Lhanbryde. The site area is 2568sqm in size and gradually rises to the south. To the north and west of the site is open countryside, and to the south east there are five dwellinghouses.

### Policy Assessment Siting and Character (DP1, DP4, EP4)

Policy DP4 sets out the requirements for rural housing proposals, through the means of a development hierarchy. In this hierarchy the majority of rural housing development is to be accommodated within identified Rural Groupings, followed by the re-use of site's where development has previously occurred and finally to sites in the open countryside. Given the high levels of rural housing development, in many areas of Moray, the open countryside has been identified as either being a Pressurised and Sensitive Area or in an area of immediate pressure. In this instance the proposed site is located in a Pressurised and Sensitive Area. No siting or design criteria is set out within Pressurised and Sensitive Areas as new housing in these locations is not supported.

Policy EP4 sets out the requirements for dealing with development in the Countryside around Towns (CAT) which are classed as sensitive areas and are designated as such to prevent development sprawl into the countryside and to maintain the distinction between the countryside and the town. No new rural housing will be permitted within these areas unless the criteria set out in Policy EP4 is met. The proposed site sits within the CAT area around Elgin and does not involve the rehabilitation, conversion, limited extension, replacement or change of use of any existing buildings or for the purpose of agriculture, forestry or low intensity recreational or tourism; or is designated as long term housing allocation released for development. The proposals do not fall within any of the above mentioned criteria.

Policy DP1 requires development to be of a scale, density and character which is appropriate to the surrounding area, and must be integrated into the surrounding landscape. Policy DP1 also states that proposals should not adversely impact the amenity of any neighbouring properties. As this application is for Planning Permission in Principle (PPP) no detailed designs or material finishes have been submitted and would be assessed in any forthcoming full application if permission was granted.

The proposed house site sits within a Pressurised and Sensitive Area where this is no scope for new rural housing. The introduction of a new dwellinghouse in this location will have an adverse impact on the character and appearance of the surrounding area given that the site lacks the required immediate (on the boundary of the site) backdrop of existing landform, trees and buildings to provide acceptable enclosure.

In addition to this the proposed introduction of a further house in this location alongside existing housing would contribute to unacceptable cumulative build-up which will negatively impact the landscape character of this area.

The propose house site is located within the Countryside Around Towns Area identified by Policy EP4, and would not fall with any of the excepted categories of development permitted under this policy, and as such would result in development sprawl into the countryside affecting the special character of this area.

On this basis the proposal would be contrary to Policy DP1, DP4 and EP4 of the Moray Local Development Plan 2020.

# Water and Drainage (EP12 and EP13)

Scottish Water has raised no objection to the proposals subject to their Pre-Development Enquiry process, however there are no waste water facilities in the vicinity of this development and therefore the applicant would need to investigate private treatments. In this regard the proposals show a septic tank with soakaway positioned on the site plan, with the latter supported by SuDS calculations. The Flood Risk Management Section have assessed and are content with this information, and have raised no objections to the proposals.

However this is separate from and does not override the unacceptable siting impact of the development as contrary to the requirements of Policy DP1, DP4 and EP4.

#### **Access and Parking**

The Transportation Manager has raised no objections to the proposal and has recommended conditions to ensure safe access and parking on the site should permission be granted. These include the provision of visibility splays and the upkeep of these, the provision of and Electrical vehicle (EV) charging point, parking and turning, as well as the first 10 metres of the road to be surfaced in bituminous macadam across the full existing width. A condition is also recommended in regards to the proposed bin store and its positioning. The proposal would comply with the relevant access and parking requirements of Policy DP1 (ii) and PP3.

However this is separate from and does not override the unacceptable siting impact of the development as contrary to the requisite elements of Policy DP1, DP4 and EP4.

#### **Developer Obligations and Affordable Housing Contribution (PP3 and DP2)**

Developer contributions towards healthcare and a contribution to affordable housing is required as part of the proposal. Payment of the contributions and affordable housing contribution would be undertaken through an upfront payment or through the provision of a Section 75 Agreement.

The applicant/agent has confirmed acceptance of the identified obligations should planning permission be given. This acceptance of developer obligations and affordable housing contributions

is separate from and does not override the unacceptable impact of the development as contrary to the requisite elements of Policy DP1, DP4 and EP4.

### **Conclusion and Recommendation**

The proposal would result in the introduction of a new dwellinghouse in a pressurised and sensitive area and a countryside around towns area where new housing is not permitted, and will contribute to an unacceptable cumulative build-up of housing and adversely affect the character and appearance of these protected areas. It is therefore contrary to Policies DP1, DP4 and EP4 and is recommended for refusal.

## **Background to Application**

The applicant, Mr Steve Cox, is working on behalf of a Mr Jim Silvestri who has lived at North Darkland farm for his entire life and his family have lived on the farm for 100 years. Unfortunately, Mr Silvestri's health is not what it was and he now wishes to build a bungalow adjacent to 1-5 Darklands so that he can continue to help out in the day to day running of the farm with a view to retirement in the future. The proposal would allow him to still be involved as much as possible in the farm while residing in more comfortable accommodation.

### Reasons for Refusal i

In the refusal notice for the proposal the council state the following -

The proposal is contrary to policies DP4 Part d) ii), DP1(i) and EP4 for the following reasons:

i) The proposal site falls within the Pressurised and Sensitive Area identified by Policy DP4 Part d) ii), in which no new house sites will be permitted due to the detrimental landscape and visual impacts associated with high levels of rural housing build up in these areas. The proposed house in this location is contrary to Policy DP4 and DP1(i). The proposed new dwellinghouse will have an adverse impact on the character and appearance of the surrounding area given that the site lacks the required immediate (on the boundary of the site) backdrop of existing landform, trees and buildings to provide acceptable enclosure.

## Response to Refusal i (please refer to aerial map below)

We understand that the site falls within into a pressurised and sensitive area however given the context that the proposal would be located adjacent to an already established build-up of houses we feel that another house would not have any detrimental landscape or visual impact at this location compared to say a new house in a corner of a field with no enclosure or containment.

We believe that this area of ground lends itself to an additional house and that the proposal would integrate well into the surrounding landscape for the following reasons -

- EXISTING HOUSES PROVIDING ENCLOSURE 5no. existing dwelling-houses next door which would provide a context for this proposal and would help it blend in to the landscape, ensuring it is not a "stand alone" proposal but rather part of a small settlement with containment and enclosure (see photo on page 3).
- MATURE TREES / ESTABLISHED WOODLAND a grouping of existing mature trees are located to the south which would give a backdrop to the dwelling-house. Further, a row of existing mature trees exist at the roadside providing a level of softening and concealment.

### Reasons for Refusal ii and iii

ii) The proposed introduction of a further house in this location alongside existing housing is considered to constitute an unacceptable cumulative build-up of housing which will negatively impact the landscape character of this area.


iii) The site falls within the Countryside Around Towns Area identified by Policy EP4, in which no new rural housing will be permitted unless the proposal involves the rehabilitation, conversion, limited extension, replacement; or change of use of existing buildings or for the purpose of agriculture, forestry or low intensity recreational or tourism; or is designated as long term housing allocation released for development. The proposals do not fall within any of the above criteria and will result in development sprawl into the countryside affecting the special character of this area.

## Response to Refusal ii and iii

ii) We disagree with this point. We strongly feel that the proposal would compliment the existing settlement here. If planning were granted, a sensitive bungalow design would be proposed to integrate with the houses which exist at the moment. The design would be based around the Moray Council Rural Housing design criteria.

Further to this, the existing settlement creates a backdrop for the proposed house. This backdrop would ensure that the proposal was in no way prominant or an unacceptable addition to the existing settlement. We would consider this proposal part of a jigsaw, complimenting and enhancing what exists at the moment (please see annotated photo below).

ii) While we acknowledge the site falls within the CAT (Countryside Around Town) identified by EP4 in the Moray Local Plan 2020 we are of the opinion that the proposal would not only integrate well with the existing settlement for reasons already mentioned but would also enhance the area. We would also like to point out that although Mr Silvestri's health is not what it was he is still very keen to play a part in the day to day running of the farm and to build a house himself for semi-retirement purposes leading to eventual full retirement. The proposal does not directly fit into one of above mentioned CAT exceptions however we would stress that the proposal should be approved for reasons of necessity to allow the applicant to enjoy a more comfortable life and to be able to play a part in the continuation of the farm business he has been involved with all his life. This proposal would be for his own use.



## Conclusion

In conclusion, we respectfully ask the LRB panel to consider what this proposal means for the Mr Silvestri.

Mr Steve Cox is the applicant for this proposal however he is acting on behalf of Mr Silvestri who has lived at North Darklands farm for his entire life and wishes to semi-retire to a bungalow here so that he can help out in the day to day running of the farm. The farm itself will be changing hands at some point however the future owner, Mr Ian Dean, is very keen to retain Mr Silvestri's services due to his invaluable knowledge and experience of farming (please see supporting letter from Mr Dean).

Further to the above, Mr Silvestri would be looking to build the proposed house himself for semiretirement purposes leading to full retirement. The proposal would be a perfect answer for his needs.

In terms of planning policy we understand why the planning department did not support the application given the fact that it is located in the CAT however we strongly feel that a house at this location would not only have a positive impact but would integrate well with an already established settlement and we would ask for an exception to be made in this case.

We respectfully ask that the appointed LRB panel approves this appeal.

The maximum children I would care for after is 15 (3 of these are my own children and live at the premises). The maximum number of children I will be caring for until 2023/2024 is 12. I'm applying to increase to 15 now so that I don't have to repeat the process again in the future. The recurrent costs of applying for a small business are not cost effective, especially during the Covid Pandemic. I will be employing 2 staff. 1 lives at the premises. Their working hours will be from 8.30am till 4.30pm. We have adequate space for my staff to park their cars on our drive.

**Issue:** Contributors welcome the service provided and are supportive of the proposed expansion.

**Comments (PO):** The support for the business is noted.

**Issue:** The development will not create nuisance.

**Comments (PO):** While the development may not give rise to a statutory nuisance in terms of noise or other pollution the level of use proposed would impact on the surrounding area.

#### **OBSERVATIONS - ASSESSMENT OF PROPOSAL**

Section 25 of the 1997 Act as amended requires applications to be determined in accordance with the development plan i.e. the adopted Moray Local Development Plan 2020 (MLDP) unless material considerations indicate otherwise. The main planning issues are considered below:

#### The Proposal

This application seeks to increase the number of children that can be cared for at an existing child minder at a house on Smith Drive in Elgin and increase the opening hours. Planning Permission has been granted (21/00400/APP) which allows for a maximum of 9 children to be cared for at any one time. The current proposal is to increase this number to 15 (of which 3 are the applicants own children). This will require the employment of a third member of staff. The existing permission allows for the child minder to operate between 8 am and 6pm Monday - Friday. The current application seeks to increase the opening hours to 7:30 am - 6pm. No weekend working is proposed.

#### The Site

The site is an existing house in a residential area of Elgin. There is a parking area at the front and an enclosed garden area to the rear.

#### **Principle of Development (DP1)**

While the facts of each case must be assessed separately it is generally accepted that child minders who care for up to 6 children in their own home with no other members of staff employed do not require planning permission as this level of use remains commensurate with the use of the house as a house and does not represent a material change of use. This reflects the Care Commission registration requirements for this type of business. In this case planning permission (21/00400/APP) has been granted for the care of up to 9 children (of which 3 are the children of the applicant) to be cared for by two people who both live on site. The current application seeks to increase the maximum number of children that can be cared for at any one time to 15 and employ an additional member of staff who will not live on site. This represents a significant intensification which would radically alter the character of the use of the premises. The activity of arrival and departure of children and staff and the level of noise and activity throughout the day would be significantly different from that associated with a house or indeed a house with a small ancillary child-minding use. It is noted from the representations that the service provided is highly valued however, the numbers of children and staff proposed is more akin to a small nursery than a strictly child-minding use and as such is not appropriate in a house in residential area. The site is located on a guiet residential street in a built up area. The proposed expansion is not of a scale or character that is appropriate to the surrounding area and the increase in activity in this quiet residential street would adversely impact on

neighbouring houses resulting in an overbearing loss of amenity. The proposal is therefore contrary to Policy DP1 (i) (a) and (e).

The proposed extension to the opening hours from 8am-6pm to 7:30am-6pm is a minor change and. Environmental Health have no objection. The proposed hours would be acceptable on week days in this location.

#### Parking (DP1)

There is an existing parking area in front of the house and on-street parking is available. The Transportation Manager has no objection subject to a condition requiring the existing parking to be retained throughout the lifetime of the development. This is in line with the terms of the previous permission (21/400/APP). Subject to the suggested condition the proposal would comply with policy DP1 (ii).

#### Recommendation

This application relates to an established business that provides a highly valued service to its customers. However, the site is in a quiet residential area and further expansion of the business in this location would not be appropriate to the character of the area and would adversely impact on the amenity of neighbouring houses. The proposal is contrary to Policy DP1 (i) (a) and (e) and as such is recommended for refusal.
